One day as a Hospice nurse

Rona Thornton

Our nurses are the heart and soul of St Columba's Hospice, caring and supporting more than 1,000 patients and their loved ones each year. Rona Thornton (*pictured*), who has been a nurse in our in-patient unit for 15 years, took a quick break to tell us about her role and what she loves about nursing.

What is a typical working day like for you?

My day starts with a handover from the night-shift team and an evaluation of each patient's care needs. I then visit my patients to discuss how they are and administer medicine to manage their pain and symptoms. In the afternoon I catch up with relatives, accept new admissions and carefully prepare any patients for discharge to go home. My day finishes with paperwork and handing over to the next shift. We provide a 24 hour assessment of care and condition of every patient.

What do you love most about being a nurse at St Columba's Hospice?

The Hospice's saying that we make every minute count is central to the care we provide. We encourage and help patients and families



to enjoy the time they have left together. It's challenging work but it's teamwork, and when the challenges get too big there's always someone who can support me. There are tears, but there's plenty of laughter here too.

What is different about being a nurse at a Hospice?

I think we have a very experienced team who get to know patients and families, which gives us the chance to create very close bonds. About 10 years ago a patient and his fiancée asked me to be their bridesmaid. They didn't have much time left together, so they decided to get married in the Hospice's Columba Room – it was a privilege to share in such an important day

and I cherish the memory. We always try to make life special for our patients. We respect, encourage and actively help families celebrate anniversaries, birthdays, christenings – anything that is deemed important in day to day life.

What are you looking forward to about working in the new Hospice?

Palliative care has changed so much over the years, so to have a new Hospice to meet future care needs will be a massive improvement. In our new building, patients will have bigger rooms, facilities will be updated and there will be space in the single rooms for families to stay overnight. We are so lucky, it's going to be fantastic.

Summertime in our charity shops

Summer is here, albeit a Scottish one, and what better way to welcome a new season than by de-cluttering your closet and donating your items to our charity shops? You might even find a lovely new summer outfit while you're in there! Here, we find out the latest happenings from our wonderful charity shops.

Item of the moment

MUCH HILARITY greeted the discovery of this month's novelty item, which Jessie and Frances volunteered to demonstrate for us (*pictured right*), Dr Macaura's patented blood circulator or pulsocon. The device was manufactured in the 1890's and claims to cure deafness, polio, anaemia, heart disease and cramp by vibrations. To use it you just turn the handle and apply it to the required part of the body – it produces 2,000 vibrations a minute! Dr Macaura did concede that it would not cure baldness or advanced TB.

The patients paid between 38 and 50 shillings for the pulsocon. The pulsocon is a fascinating item, and aside from providing much entertainment in the shop, it will be sent to auction to raise funds for the Hospice.



News from the West End

OUR WEST END shop is now offering a hat matching service. Customers are invited to bring an outfit to the shop and then Anna, the store manager, will team it with one of over 75 fabulous hats from their collection. They have styles and colours for all occasions, and particularly hats for weddings and special events.

Rebuild project *update*

News from the site

IT'S BEEN A BUSY few months on the site of our new Education Centre next door at 17 Boswall Road. Building work is progressing well and is running on time and on budget. The structure of the lecture theatre is now almost complete, with the foundations laid and the steelwork and walls in place. It's really exciting to see it taking shape – our students are certainly going to enjoy some terrific views of the Firth of Forth while they are attending their courses!

Refurbishment work on the inside of the building has also started, to create offices, a library and a learning centre. Works are due to be finished by the end of this year, with the rebuilding of our main site on track to start in early 2012.

Maritime past of Education Centre

LIKE CHALLENGER Lodge at St Columba's Hospice, which was named after the Challenger expedition ship by then owner Sir John Murray, the father of modern oceanography, our new



Education Centre at 17 Boswall Road also has some interesting links to maritime history.

The house was once owned by industrial magnate, Sir John Donald Pollock (after whom the Pollock Halls at Edinburgh University are named). Sir Donald installed a series of ornate iron railings to form the fence of the property, which he acquired from ironwork from the RMS Aquitania when she was scrapped.



Aquitania (*pictured*) was the largest and most luxurious liner of her time, and is widely

considered one of the most beautiful ships ever built. She later served in military service in both World Wars.

We're happy to report that the railings will be remaining an important part of 17 Boswall Road.
